



Please Be Mindful / Did You Know?

Property Taxes – are due by December 31, 2025. We accept the following methods of payment: cash, cheque, credit card, debit, online banking, and post-dated cheques. Consider sending in your payment early to avoid any mail delays! You can also contact your bank to set up monthly payments towards your taxes.

Water Meters – we plan to restart meter changes this fall. The Town Office will contact those needing new meters to set up appointments in the near future.

Garbage & Recycle Carts - Please remove your garbage and recycle carts from the street as soon as possible after pickup. Some people are leaving their carts on the street for days after pickup which can cause issues with traffic, and it will soon hinder snow removal.

Tree Pruning - We'd like to remind residents that all trees, shrubs, and hedges are to be regularly pruned so they do not overhang or encroach on any sidewalks or back alleys. Any branches extending over sidewalks should be trimmed to a minimum height of 8 feet. JaT Tree Service will be coming this fall to trim Town trees, if you are wanting to book them for your tree maintenance.



Street Sweeping - Virtue Constructing will once again be doing our fall street sweeping. Once dates are confirmed, we ask residents to assist in achieving a thorough clean by ensuring vehicles are removed from the streets.

Back Alleys – Back alleys are not the place to pile your grass clippings, tree trimmings, rocks, broken down vehicles or garbage that should be hauled to the landfill. Grass clippings and garden waste can be hauled to the compost area. Trees, rocks and garbage should be hauled to the landfill on a timely basis. All vehicles need to be parked on your property. Having all of this material in the back alleys attracts rodents and makes it difficult for the Town to maintain in the summer and nearly impossible to get down to clear snow.

Panther Swimming Pool

Even though we had a rough start to our swimming season when there were issues with the boiler, we had a great season at the pool. Some of the extras offered were Diving and Water Polo Clinics, Lane Swim, Aqua Size Classes.

We had 163 students enrolled in classes. 4 of our instructors were also available to teach some private lessons for those students that needed a little one on one attention.

We had 10 students successfully pass Bronze Medallion & 12 students pass Bronze Cross. That is a positive sign for potential future lifeguards.
