

**BYLAW NO. 826**  
**A Bylaw of the Town of Davidson to Regulate and To Establish Rates for the  
Collection, Removal, and Disposal of Solid Wastes or Other Refuse in the  
Town and Town Waste Disposal Site**

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The Council of the Town of Davidson, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. In this bylaw, the following definitions shall apply:
  - a) "Domestic Waste" means putrescible animal, mineral and vegetable waste resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking and consumption of food.
  - b) "Liquid Domestic Waste" means any waste which contains animal, mineral or vegetable matter in solution or suspension.
  - c) "Refuse" means all wastes, including domestic waste, rubbish, street cleanings, and yard clippings but does not include liquid domestic waste.
  - d) "Bulk Refuse" means wood, trees, shrubs, stumps, branches.
  - e) "Designated Areas" means separate sites within the waste disposal site set aside for particular disposal i.e.: whites, metal, asphalt, concrete, compost, clean wood, and domestic waste.
  - f) "Working Face" means the site within the waste disposal grounds for the disposal of domestic waste and refuse.
  - g) "Waste Disposal Site" means the municipal waste disposal site located on SE 21-26-28-W2.
  - h) "Whites" means large metallic objects such as major appliances, water heaters, stoves, furnaces, washers, dryers, refrigerators, deep freezers, dishwashers, bed springs, fencing, gates, etc.
  - i) "Participating Municipalities" means the R.M. of Willner No. 253, and the R.M. of Arm River No. 252.
  
2. Domestic waste in the Town of Davidson and other participating municipalities shall be removed to the Town of Davidson Waste Disposal site by:
  - a) An employee of the Town of Davidson; or
  - b) Any person who has contracted with the Town of Davidson for that purpose; or
  - c) Approved municipal haulers with agreements with the Town of Davidson; or
  - d) Any resident of the Town or participating municipality who pays the required load fee/charge as outlined in Schedule "A", attached to this bylaw.
  
3. All permitted waste, as outlined in Schedule "B" attached to this bylaw, shall be deposited in the designated areas of the waste disposal site.
  
4. Unpermitted waste, as outlined in Schedule "B" attached to this bylaw, will not be accepted at the waste disposal site.

5. Liquid domestic waste shall not be deposited in the waste disposal site. Subject to the approval of the Saskatchewan Ministry of Environment, liquid domestic waste shall be disposed of by:
  - a) Tanking and depositing into an approved sewage disposal system.
  - b) Spreading and incorporation into agricultural land with the approval of the Ministry of Environment and the landowner.
6. No person shall place, dump or dispose of any domestic waste, refuse, whites or bulk refuse in, near or over the gate at the waste disposal site or on any roadway leading to the waste disposal site.
7. The waste disposal site shall be enclosed by a fence. The ramp area and working face shall be fenced with litter fencing. The Town of Davidson reserves the right to lock the gate to the site, making it inaccessible to all residents of the Town of Davidson and participating municipalities outside the designated times as outlined in Schedule "C" of this bylaw.
8. Signs shall be erected stating the rules of the operation and marking the designated areas.
9. No person shall deface, destroy, or alter any signs, gates or fencing at the waste disposal site.
10. Absolutely no scavenging is allowed at the waste disposal site.
11. Load fees to be collected, prior to unloading, by a representative of the Town of Davidson are as set out in Schedule "A" attached.
12. By hauling a load of refuse to the waste disposal site, the person delivering the load, or the property owner from which that load originated if the load is being hauled by a contractor, is considered to have had a work or service performed by the Town of Davidson by agreement. If the amount owing for that work or service is still outstanding within 12 months of it being performed, the Town of Davidson may add that charge to any arrears of taxes on land owned by the person in respect to such work or service as per Section 405 of *The Municipalities Act*.
13. Any person contravening any provisions of Sections 2 to 10 of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and is liable upon summary conviction to a fine of not less than \$500.00, in addition to the Town of Davidson's clean-up and legal costs.
14. Any person found guilty of neglecting or refusing to pay the rates established in this bylaw shall be subject to a minimum fine of \$100.00 up to a maximum fine of \$250.00, in addition to the load fee that was to be collected.
15. Rates for the collection of refuse are in accordance with Schedule "D" of this Bylaw; unless collection of refuse has been contracted directly by the property owner/tenant to a third party such as in the case of steel bins.
16. This bylaw shall come into force and take effect on January 1, 2026.

17. Bylaw No. 818 is hereby repealed.

- Fees above also apply to loads of concrete or asphalt. Concrete and asphalt cannot contain rebar or refuse.
- All contractors shall sort their loads. Pit garbage, mixed with dimensional lumber, will be subject to an increased charge of triple the regular rate.

### Waste Collection Rates

Effective January 1, 2026 – \$16.06 per month per garbage cart; to be charged on quarterly residential and commercial utility billing where those services are provided.

Effective January 1, 2026 – \$10.87 per month per recycle cart; to be charged on quarterly residential and commercial utility billing where those services are provided.
